Conference Space & Additional Study Rooms

EV Charging Unit

Electric vehicle owners visiting Aspen Drive Library in Vernon Hills will be pleased to find two new 240-volt charging units from Libertyville-based company EVBox. Each unit provides 7.2 kilowatts of charge per hour and is compatible with nearly all electric vehicles, providing up to 25 miles of driving range for each hour of charging. A fee of 20¢/kWh is currently set to cover the cost of electricity plus the costs associated with the equipment and installation.

Look for these units in Aspen's north parking lot near the Drive-Up Window. More information about using the units can be found at cooklib.org/EVcharging.
