About the Charging Units

Two Level 2 Igon charging units deliver a robust 7.2 kilowatts per hour, ensuring you'll be back on the road in no time.

Charger Location

Conveniently positioned on the northwest side of the Library's parking lot near the Drive-Up Window, two parking spaces are reserved specifically for vehicles using the charger.

Charging is Simple

Download the Evxy app from the App Store or Google Play and seamlessly initiate and monitor your charging session from anywhere. It's the hassle-free way to power up your vehicle while you go about your day.

Available to Anvone

Charging is open to the public, regardless of Library cardholder status. If you do have a Cook Memorial Public Library card, we encourage you to come into the building and use any of our in-house services while your vehicle charges. If you do not have a Library card with us, you may still come into the building to browse, use our Wi-Fi, or get a guest pass to use the Library's in-house computers.

Cost

Some free units in the area experience high demand, leading to frustratingly long wait times. Meanwhile, other units charge upwards of 30 or 40 cents per kilowatt-hour (kWh). However, at Aspen Drive Library, a nominal fee of only 20 cents/kWh covers electricity and equipment maintenance costs. This ensures sustainable, accessible, and reliable service, providing you with a convenient and cost-effective alternative to other charging units.
