

On July 10, 2010, Aspen Drive Library opened its doors ' and welcomed the Vernon Hills community into a bright, modern space designed for connection, learning, and growth. What began as a long-awaited solution to a growing population's needs has become a beloved destination serving thousands each year.

The journey to Aspen Drive Library's opening was years in the making. In the 1990s and early 2000s, the Cook Memorial Public Library District faced challenges due to a growing population, limited space at its Libertyville location, and increasing demand for library services in the southern part of the district. To address these constraints, the district opened the Evergreen Interim Library in 2003 inside Vernon Hills' Village Hall, providing a temporary solution while plans for a permanent library took shape.
